Drain commission- Stager and Fortune boards are installed, none on Sunset at this time. Road restrictions are still on, will be looking at lifting starting next week. Hagerman Lake Association meeting will be held June 18. Commissioner Germic to attend. We will be contacting Bacco about the possibility of patching or selling us the mix for this road this summer. Franzene and Nelson roads will be upgraded so they can be plowed this coming winter. Federal/State buyout program of 90 cents on the dollar has been approved by the Governor as of Oct 2022.
