REGULAR MEETING

The regular meeting of the Board of County Road Commissioners of Iron County was held on Tuesday, May 13, 2025, at 8:30 a.m. in the Road Commission office at 800 W. Franklin Street, Iron River, Michigan.

Chairman Schmidt led the Pledge of Allegiance and opened the meeting.

Present for the roll call were Chairman Ernie Schmidt, Vice-Chairman Ron Frailing and Commissioners Dan Germic, Chuck Battan and Jim Cihak Also, present: Superintendent/ Manager Brad Toivonen, Finance Director Michelle Johnson, HR-PR Administrators Emily Bieghler and Patti Leonoff, Shop Foreman Dean Stolberg, Maintenance Foreman Rob Johnson, Bates Twp. Supervisor Mike Stafford, Mastodon Township Trustee Dave Smith, Ean Bruette, County Commissioner, Attorney Mark Tousignant, Craig Richardson and Brian Schmutzler from Wickwire and Brian Schiavo, GEI Consultants.

ADDITIONS TO THE AGENDA

Finance Director Johnson requested the addition of 11. i. MDOT Engineers' Reimbursement Request. Motion by Commissioner Battan, with support from Germic, to accept the agenda, with the addition. Voice vote, all in favor, motion carried.

SUPERINTENDENTS REPORT

Superintendent Toivonen reviewed his report:

Admin. fee information was submitted to MDOT regarding the Iron River salt shed replacement; the contract should be ready for review in a couple of months.

The repair quote for the Iron River garage roof came in at \$80,000 and is not within the budget for this year.

Primary Roads:

Hagerman Lake Rd. PH1 and CR 424PH7 are ready to go and the MDOT Category "D" funds will be here this week. The Houghton CRC buyout agreement for the 2026 Hagerman Lake Rd. PH2 is set to go.

Doug Tomasoski has been hired to complete the PASER ratings for the primary and local roads this spring, with the possibility of evaluating and locating culverts if time allows.

The ER projects will be starting soon, and detours will be in place within the next few weeks.

Local Roads:

The culvert for Trybom Dr. has been ordered and should be here within a month. Our crew will be putting it in sometime in August or September.

Mr. Johnson has been sent a final notice on the encroachment issues on county roads Little Finland and Baker. If the issue is not completely resolved by May 31, we will be moving forward with law enforcement.

Mr. Shepard, the property owner at Little Finland/ Morrison Creek has been in communication regarding the abandonment process. A petition has not yet been received, but he has been informed again that a public hearing is required and that the Township and MDNR have first rights to the property if abandoned due to the waterway existing in the right of way of the road in question. The Commissioners requested more information on policies and statutes regarding our rights and responsibilities when property owners put up gates and signage on public roads.

Bids have gone out on behalf of Mastodon Township for gravel work on Armstrong Lake and are due May 22nd. We will be doing an estimate for our crews to replace the culvert prior to the gravel being done. Bates Township has also requested bids be obtained for a gravel job; this will go out soon.

Fleet / Equipment:

Our onboarding of the Samsara GPS/Cameras has interested several other road commissions, who are asking lots of questions and doing trials of the equipment.

We will be trialing a new type of blade from Sharg Edges.

The second new pickup has arrived and is in the process of having the bed swapped with the utility box.

Employment Items:

The new HEOP hired for the Iron River started today and the one for Crystal Falls will hopefully begin on May 19th. Seven summer temporary employees were hired: four for Iron River and three for Crystal Falls. Emily has been doing a great job in her new position and Duane Porier was selected as the new Shop Foreman. Duane will start training around June 1st. The Mechanics Aid should be starting next week. Additionally, the Mechanics position is currently being advertised, with a closing date of May 29th.

Bridges:

There are no new developments with the Resort Dr. bridge. Supt. Toivonen still feels it may be in the best interest of the road commission to abandon the bridge, which would give the Township the opportunity to take possession and use it as a non-motorized bike path that could last for many years to come. Alternately, there are very few years left if kept open to traffic. He has reached MCRCSIP for further information.

Misc

MDOT Adopt a Highway has begun, and the roadside parks are open. Bids were sent out for a culvert replacement on M-73 and are due May 22nd. Sweeping of the trunkline intersections and the bike paths have also started.

MCRCSIP:

The trial for Treeline Dr. has been delayed until September.

Mike Phillips will be holding a Regional Work Zone Safety training session at the Oss garage on May 15th, with several other road commissions also in attendance. New ICRC employees will be attending. The SAM meeting will take place afterward, where Supt Toivonen expects to be nominated to the SAM Board. On May 19th, another safety training will be held at the Oss garage, this time for all ICRC employees.

CRA:

The new Road Funding bill has gone to the Senate for review.

A meeting was held in Marquette between CRA, some road commission representatives and the lobbyists/companies installing fiber optic in the U.P. Th fiber optic contractors maintain that there is no need for the third-party inspections we have been requiring but sharing the incident and resulting road damage we experienced on Rawnick Rd. has opened some eyes to the problems we have been facing.

Seasonal weight restrictions will all be lifted as of May 14, 2025.

Michigan Dept. of Treasury:

Brenda Drayton performed our exit interview for our FY2024 fiscal audit. Everything went very well and there were a few minor adjustments. The finalized audit has not yet been received, but once it is complete Brenda should be able to present it as in previous years.

Fiber Optic:

Restoration for last year's work is under way. JSI will not have any permits approved until the damage to Rawnick Rd. has been satisfactorily resolved. The road fabric, drain tile and gravel need to be addressed and an estimate for ICRC crews to do the work has already been sent to the contractor for review. The Third-party Inspection Fee agreement has not yet been received from Highline. A new company, Michigan Broadband, has just started submitting permits.

Parks and Rec:

Supt. Toivonen met with Rich Sloat at the fish hatchery to look at the driveway and nearby ditching of the county road.

Drain Commissioner:

The board at Stager Lake was not put in as there is already beaver activity causing the water to be high. The Fortune Lake board was put in on May 6, 2025, and the one for Sunset Lake is still out. To save on costs, a game camera has been ordered for both Fortune and Stager Lake. This will allow some remote viewing, with hopes of cutting back on the cost involved for the Foreman to drive out as often.
